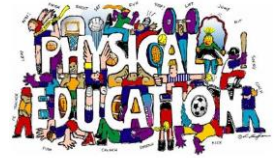




## Primary PE sport grant report 2017-2018

### Objectives of spending the funding 2017-2018

#### **Key indicator 1 - the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.**

- To pay for a TA to help with the general running of PE such as by sorting clubs and the cupboards / resources and to give time for the PE Co-ordinator to analyse the planning and PE progress the children are making.
- To recover our gym tables which have come up as 'advisory' on our latest inspection. Allowing all children to participate in gymnastic lessons safely.

#### **Key indicator 2 - the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.**

- To raise the profile of OAA (Outdoor Adventurous Activities) at our school. We believe that the children should be given the opportunities to visit the beach, forest and be challenged outside of their comfort zone during OAA type activities. This is something that a lot of our children do not have the chance to experience so we will allocate each class some funding for this to happen.
- To pay for a TA to run a leadership programme for our sports captains and other year 6 pupils designed to help raise the profile of school sport.
- To be able to hire a minibus and pay for a swimming coach for those children in year 6 who have not yet met the requirements to swim 25 metres by the time they leave primary school.

#### **Key indicator 3 - increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.**

- To use the outside company Achieve4All to help build the confidence of teaching PE for our teachers. This company will work alongside those teachers who want support with their planning, delivering or assessment of their pupils during their PE sessions. These coaches will not be teaching the lessons for the teachers, they will be supporting them and they will work alongside each other.

#### **Key indicator 4 - broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.**

- To create our own orienteering trail around the school for the children to practise on before going out of the school around Cranbrook or at the country park. This trail will include 15 wooden posts with screws put in at different places around the school and 5 metal eye screws which will allow orienteering flags to be tied to for the children to find. This trail can also be used across the age range of the school as the posts will allow anything to be tied to them such as pictures or letters for the younger children to find.
- To replace any PE equipment and resources which have been lost or damaged over time. To

buy new sporting equipment to introduce a wider range of sports for the children.

- To use some of our money to pay for after school coaches to give the children a varied and rich PE experience.
- To buy PE equipment to increase the early years and year 1 fine motor and coordination skills and to ensure they have an active time in their outside area.

**Key indicator 5 - increased participation in competitive sport.**

- To pay for a TA to run regular fixtures with our local primary school after school. This will include medals for participation at the end of the year.
- To be able to hire a minibus so that we can take more children to any sports competitions and events as before we have been reliant on using staff cars. This has meant we have not taken as many children as we could have. We can then provide more children with enriched sporting opportunities and increase the profile of sport within the school.

**Swimming requirements for the end of Primary school** (we swim in the summer term so this will be updated at the end of the year)

**Objective** - to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Number of year 6 pupils - 55

Percentage of pupils who have met the swimming requirements - 71% (39/55)

Percentage of pupils who have not yet met the swimming requirements - 29% (16/55)
