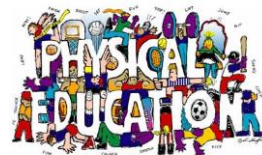




Primary PE sport grant report 2014-2015

Objectives of spending the funding 2014-2015

- To participate in the Excellence in Primary Physical Education and Sports Premium Funding Babcock course (year 2) to learn about the Primary PE sport grant and how best to use the money to provide a legacy for the school.
- To buy much needed new PE equipment and resources for an ever-growing school, especially as we have now gotten so big and we don't want the children to have to share the equipment.
- To use some of our money to pay for after school coaches to give the children a varied and rich PE experience.

There are still limited resources and opportunities available at the moment due to the building works.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We have ben able to provide new clubs for the children which include: • Dance • Drama • Taekwon-do • Football x2 clubs • Tag rugby • Ultimate Frisbee • Girls football • Gymnastics (we had this for a short time due to coach illness) • These have been very popular and well attended by the children. • The parents have commented upon their views of the clubs through a questionnaire, which showed almost all positive responses.
