




Primary PE sport grant report 2016-2017

Objectives of spending the funding 2016-2017

- To join the St Luke's School Sports Partnership which aims to equip every student with the confidence, skills and knowledge to engage in active, healthy lifestyles. To promote citizenship, health and life-long learning through physical activity, dance and sport. To enable all students with a talent for dance and sport to develop and progress to the level they desire and to provide pathways for sporting participation excellence.
- To replace any PE equipment and resources which have been lost or damaged over time. To buy new sporting equipment to introduce a wider range of sports for the children.
- To use some of our money to pay for after school coaches to give the children a varied and rich PE experience.
- To pay for a TA to help with the general running of PE such as by sorting clubs and the cupboards / resources and to give time for the PE Co-ordinator to analyse the planning and PE progress the children are making.

Joining St Luke's School Sports Partnership.	£6500	To provide additional opportunities for young people to participate, perform and lead in sport, which should lead to improved academic achievement.	This has given the school many sporting opportunities. We have had access to a wider range of competitions and we have been able to send children to the gifted and talented sessions as well as having the chance to sign up to the Bronze sports leader award. We have also benefitted from time from a St Luke's coach who worked with as many teachers as possible over the year to increase their confidence at delivering high quality PE lessons. Some teachers have since commented on how helpful it was to go through the planning of a unit and to have guidance delivering it and to then look at the assessment part in more

			detail.
Sending 10 children to take part in the St Luke's School Sports partnership gifted and talented days.	£300	To provide gifted and talented PE opportunities through the excellent PE teaching of St Luke's Secondary school. We will send 6 KS2 children and 4 KS1 children.	The children all really enjoyed these sessions and it proved beneficial for them to be able to analyse their performances. They all completed baseline assessments at the first session and were able to compare their progress with testing at the end. This is not always possible in a school PE session. They also looked at how important sport is and the effect it has on your body and they learnt about healthy eating and sugar contents in food. These extra opportunities allowed these 10 children to be further pushed in their sporting abilities and to extend their knowledge of the human body. After their sessions they came back and told their friends about what they have done which spread the important messages further through the school.
New PE equipment and resources for the school.	£420	To replace some of the equipment, which has been lost due to general wear and tear and to purchase new equipment for new sports.	We have been able to replace the equipment in the lunch time PE shed and to also restock the consumable PE equipment, such as the bean bags, tennis balls and small balls to continue to provide high quality PE sessions.
After school clubs coach fees.	£2380	To continue to provide the children with rich and varied after school clubs which they might not have access to at the moment as the town is being built.	For another successful year we have been able to provide the children with a range of additional after school sporting activities, which are not yet available in Cranbrook. The clubs have proved popular and the children enjoy discussing what they have achieved and learnt from each new sport.
