Why is demand for places to join Girlguiding and Scouts so high?

The Scout Association said nearly 90,000 young people across the UK are currently on waiting lists and Girlguiding has nearly 55,000 people waiting for a place.

Simon Carter, national spokesperson for the Scout Association, said that in the last year membership has grown by 16%. "We have not seen this level of growth since the Second World War, lockdown was a grim period for young people. They couldn't go anywhere. There is now more zeal for the outdoors."

Girlguiding's Girls' Attitudes Survey found 61% of girls and young women aged 11 to 21 said being part of a youth group or club makes them feel accepted, 60% connected to others, and 58% said they learn new skills.

What type of activities do the groups take part in?

In Girlguiding groups, girls take part in activities such as sleepovers, canoeing on rivers, learning about body confidence, and leading their own camps.

In Scout groups, children take part in activities such as camping, hiking, swimming, abseiling, cycling, and canoeing.

Both also place a great deal of emphasis on friendship and developing and learning new skills.
