

# St. Martin's CE Primary and Nursery School SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

We are very proud of our school and our uniform gives all our children a sense of belonging to our school community. Our school uniform can be ordered directly from our suppliers A1 Print and Stitch or Wovina - parents can find the links on the school website. All children attending St Martin's C of E Primary and Nursery school are expected to wear the school uniform, but it is acceptable for children to wear the school colours without the logo. In the nursery, the yellow sweatshirt is optional, but we find that children often enjoy having a special piece of clothing to wear to school. We are able to offer secondhand uniforms where available. Secondhand uniform is also often available in the charity shop in the parade opposite the school.

## Forest School

Children need to bring old clothes and wellies for forest school, your child's teacher will let you know which day your child will be going to the forest. If children do not have forest school clothes, they will be taken to the forest in their school clothes, this is why we strongly advise you to provide forest school clothes as children can damage their clothes in the forest.

### Make-up and jewellery

Children are asked not to wear jewellery, other than a watch, to school. If children have pierced ears, they are allowed to wear small stud earrings but these must be removed for PE as must watches.

Children are not permitted to wear make-up or nail varnish to school. If children do come to school with nail varnish or make-up on, we will send you a note asking that they don't come to school wearing it again. If children persist in wearing make-up or nail varnish, we will phone you and ask you to come and remove the make-up and/or nail varnish.
