School Uniform

Maths

The children will be going back out to the forest this term so they will need their forest clothes every week.

Computing and Humanities

We will also be learning about keeping safe online.

Science

We are learning about the life cycle of plants and growing vegetables. We will also be identifying and classifying different materials.

We will be sequencing and reinventing the story of the Enormous Turnip and looking at other traditional tales.
